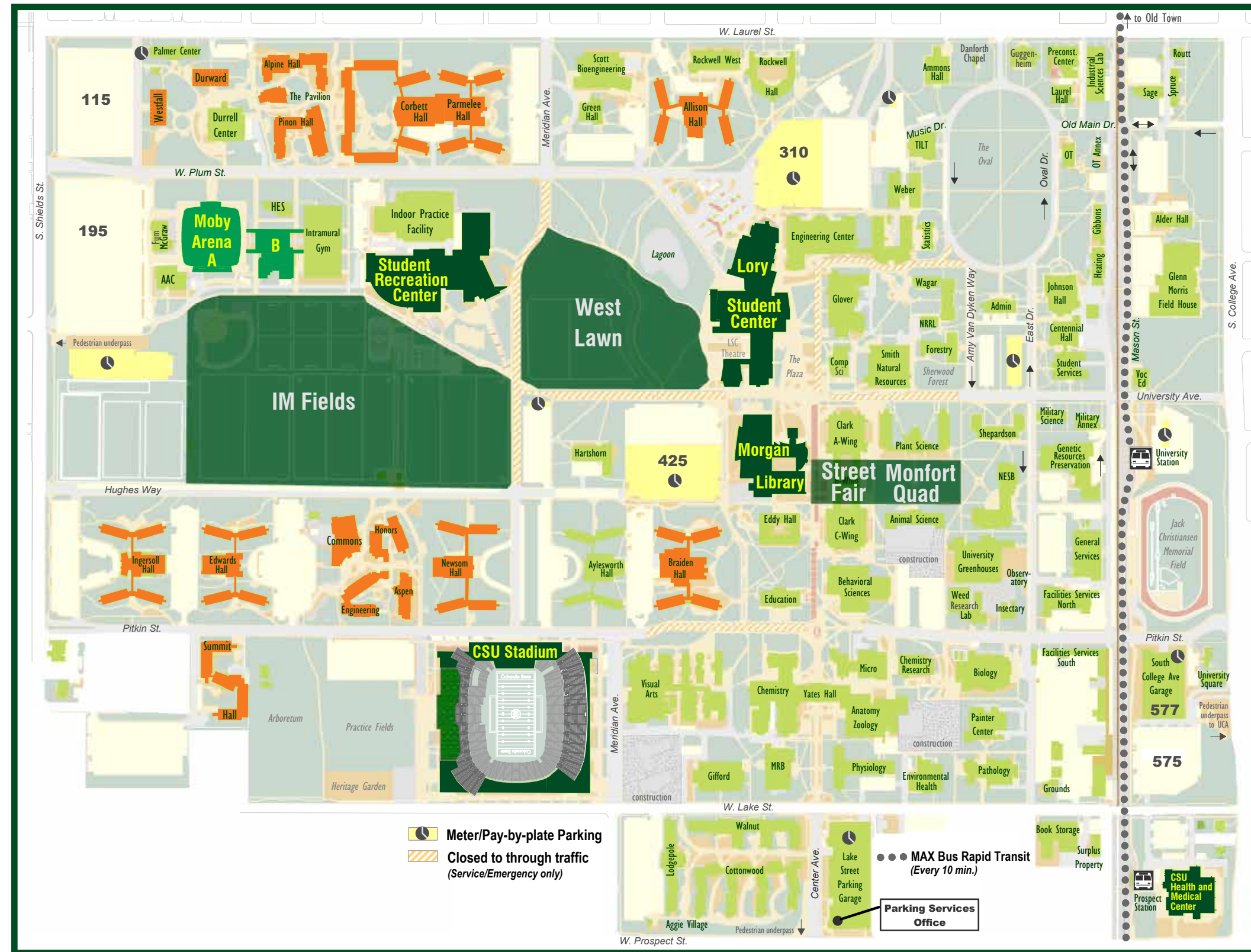
## AM I EXPECTED TO ATTEND EVERY TRANSFER RAM WELCOME EVENT?

6:30 p.m.-11 p.m. • IM Fields

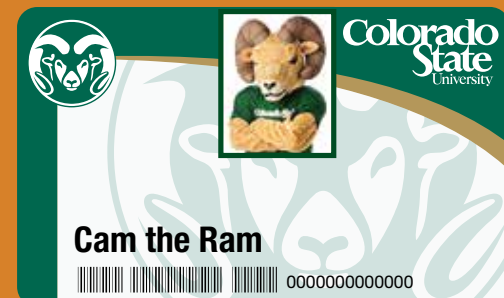
Join the CSU campus community for games, snacks, carnival rides, and music on the Intramural Fields located in front of the Student Recreation Center.
