IF I HAVE A QUESTION ABOUT RAM WELCOME WHO CAN I ASK?

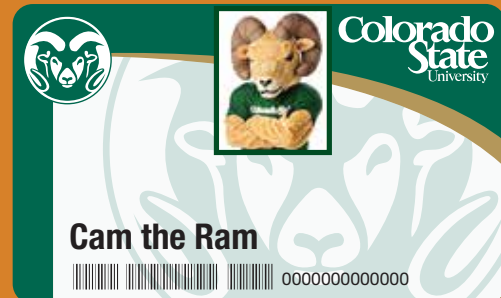

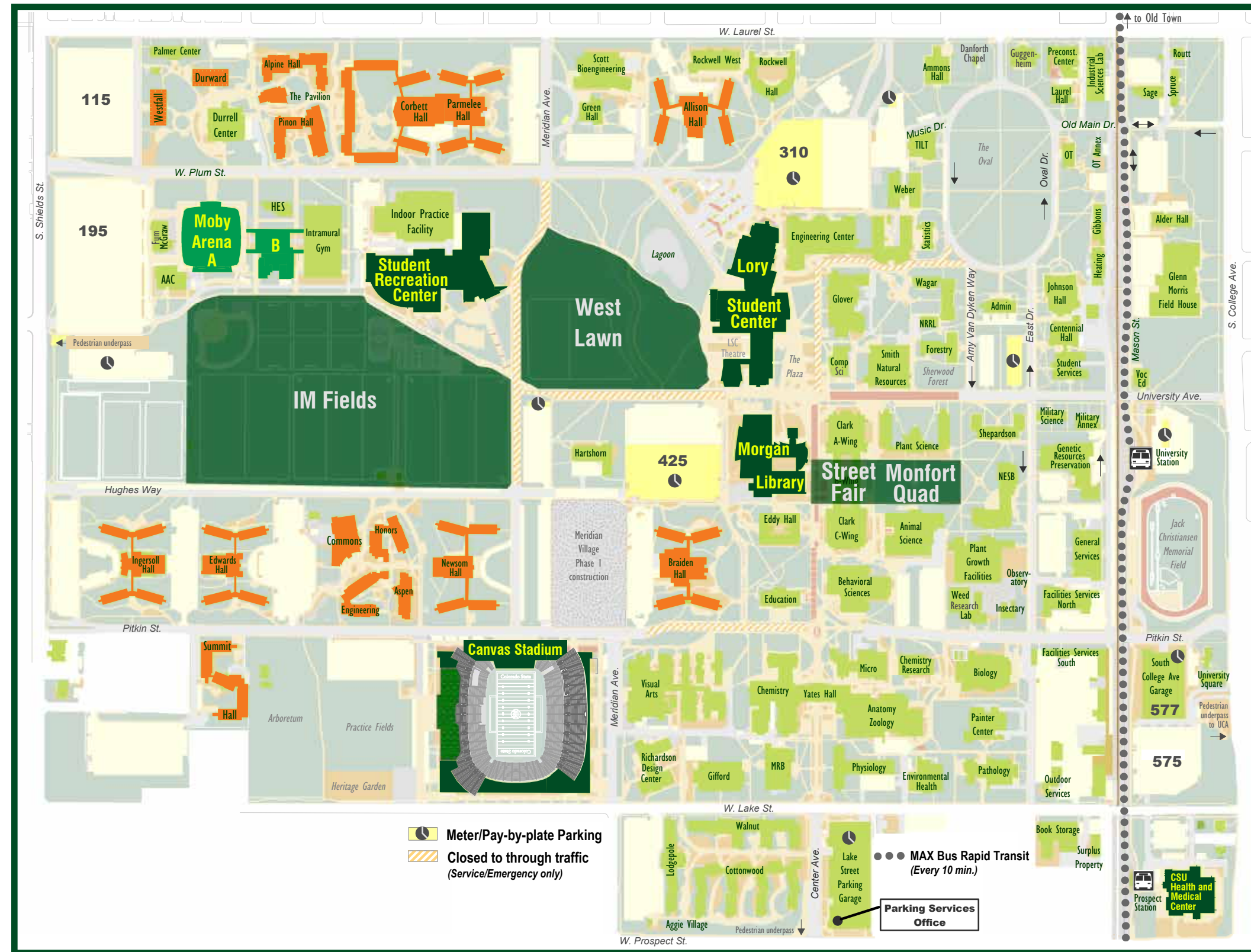
